GOSPEL: Luke 2.8-20 – [AUDREY]

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to Christ our Saviour.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel. **Praise to Christ our Lord.**

Sermon [KELVIN]

She just stood there when I opened the door. She was socially distanced and wearing a mask and she said, "Name?"

Now I'd not been expected a delivery so this was unexpected.

"Holdsworth" I said.

"No." She looked at the package and shook her head and sighed. It had obviously been a long day.

"Other Name?"

"Kelvin" I said.

"No" she said, "I don't know where this belongs" and she turned to go away.

"Well. who are you looking for?" I asked, thinking it might be for one of the other flats in the tenement.

"I'm looking for Mr Veryrev" she said. "Where is Mr Veryrev?"

"Ah," I said, rather sheepishly thinking about the pantomime title that the church bestows upon those who run cathedrals, "I think that would be me".

"Ah! Great!" she said, "I'm looking for you"

Today we celebrate the feast in a way that we've never done before. The church building is closed. But we are here and Christmas isn't cancelled. God is come into this world. A baby in a manger.

Prophets foretold him but no-one expected him to come the way he did. And none of us really expected to be celebrating Christmas in the way we are doing this year. And the thing is, when the prophets spoke of him they used plenty of fancy titles.

Wonderful. Counsellor. Mighty God. Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Basically the prophets told people to look out because Mr Very Rev was coming. Someone who was eminent, glorious, very reverend.

But it wasn't to turn out quite like that.

For no-one expected a baby. And no-one expected that it would be this baby either.

At the moment of his birth he had no titles and scarcely had a name. He wasn't grand. He came in a cow byre not a palace and though his mother would one day be called Queen of heaven, the truth is, she was a young mother whom most people wouldn't have looked at twice.

When we celebrate Christmas we are celebrating the idea that God has come into the world. That God is interested in the world. That God's saving grace is all around us. And that somehow, in an unlikely stable, an unlikely saviour was born, who was to change the world and who is still changing us and changing the world through us even now.

I have lost track of my own sorrows and losses this year. And to be honest, many people have lost far more than I have lost.

When I talk about God coming into the world at Christmas, I often talk about God coming to wipe every tear from every eye.

This year there are so many tears in so many eyes that it can seem difficult to focus on much other than our sorrows.

But the answer to sorrow isn't simply to keep repeating our sorrows. The answer to sorrow is love and it is the endless, vastness of love that preachers all over the world are trying to communicate to the sorrowful all over the world right now.

The nativity story is like so many of the Bible stories. It makes most sense if we read it in the context in which we find ourselves.

There were shepherds watching over the flocks by night.

And shepherds have watched over members of this flock by night this year in intensive care units.

Indeed, this congregation has within it those who have been cared for and those who have done the caring.

And there were magi from the East who observed the signs of the times and came in pilgrimage to Bethlehem to offer their rare gifts to the Christ Child.

And there are those whose wisdom has been the gift we needed this year. One of the thank offering that I have as I pray at the moment is that I don't know how to put into words my gratitude for those who are bringing their scientific wisdom and knowledge to bear on our situation and who are following the path towards a vaccine which seems like a bright star on the horizon to which we are all drawn.

And there were Mary and Joseph – vulnerable new parents in a borrowed room.

For Christmas began with people finding themselves where they were not expecting to be, on their own instead of in the company of family or friends. And all up and down this land this day there are people who are sharing the experience of the holy family of being somewhere strange and odd at Christmas.

And there were angels who said to everyone they encountered in the Christmas story, "Do not be afraid".

And there have been so many angels this year who have said time and time and time again to those who needed to hear it – Do not be afraid. Or who have communicated the same things in acts of kindness because words were too difficult to find.

The child in the manger wasn't grand, pompous or high and mighty.

Not Mr Very Reverend. Just a baby.

But a baby who reminds us every Christmas, no, every year, every month, every week, every day, that God's ways are the ways of love, joy and peace.

Sometimes we have known about love by the way our hearts have ached by not being able to be with those whom we want to be with.

That's one of the ways I've known love this year.

And that's sometimes the way people have described why God sent this child into the world in the first place – an action based on the heartache of not being there, not being right there in the presence of those whom God already loved.

My amazon delivery driver was desperate to find me to pass over the present that someone had unexpectedly ordered.

And God is in this world looking for each of us.

And you don't get that love by being very holy.

You don't get that love by being very good.

And you certainly don't get that love by being very reverend.

You get that love anyway.

God came to a stable to tell us exactly that...

"Ah great," God says at Christmas, looking beyond all our masks.

"I'm looking for you."

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
