

This congregation has a task – to proclaim the unconditional love of God to the people of Glasgow. Here in this place people have gathered for over a hundred years to witness in many varied ways to our experience of knowing and being loved by God.

We aspire to being a community which is open, inclusive and welcoming.

Open

The congregation here is a gathered community, each person attracted by different things. Some are attracted by the excellence of our music, some by the practical spirituality that we teach, and some by the open community of folk who meet week by week in our varied services. The hope is that we are becoming an ever more open group of people. A distinctive feature of our life is an openness to new ideas and we enjoy being challenged spiritually in fresh ways.

Worshipping at St Mary's

Everyone, young and old, is welcome to receive the bread and wine at communion in this church.

Sunday services

- **8.30 am** Eucharist (1970 Scottish Liturgy) A short service with no music lasting about 30-40 minutes.
- **10.30 am Sung Eucharist** (1982 Scottish Liturgy) This is our principal Sunday service, with full choir, organ, and sermon. Children are welcome. There is a quiet space with audio feed available for parents and infants as needed; Young Church activities take place in the Synod Hall for part of the service.
- **6.30 pm Choral Evensong** a high standard of choral music complements the traditional service of Evensong. During Lent and on other occasions there may be a sermon or address.
- **8 pm monthly The Open Silence** an hour of shared silence for thought, prayer and meditation.

Eucharist (1970 Scottish Liturgy).

About the Cathedral

The **Cathedral** was built as a church in 1871 by Sir George Gilbert Scott and has been the Episcopal Cathedral to the Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway since 1907. A £3.5 million restoration project was completed in 2002. You can find leaflets offering a self-guided tour and details of the history of the building, the murals by Gwyneth Leech, the stained glass and the organ on the table at the back of the church.

The **Synod Hall** adjoining the north of the main building is used by various groups during the week. Tea & coffee are served here and at the back of the church after the 10.30 am service on Sunday.

The Cathedral and hall are **available for hire** for events, concerts and exhibitions. Information is available from the office.

The **Cathedral Office** is housed in the ground floor of a new building in 3 Napiershall Street immediately behind the east end of Cathedral.


The clergy are also available for one to one conversations, confessions, and house blessings.
