# The Gathering – first video

## Welcome - [OLIVER]

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.** 

Welcome to this celebration—a celebration of the feast day of the saint from whom this Cathedral takes its name, Mary the Mother of the Lord. Mary's Song, which we'll hear read later in the Gospel, celebrates what seem like impossible outcomes: the hungry filled; tyrants put down and victims of their abuse raised up. These outcomes, sings Mary, are what God has planned for the world. No oppressor—not even a terrible pandemic—will have the last word. And that is what we proclaim, with Mary, today.

## **Collect for Purity - [HELENA]**

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

#### Confession

[KELVIN] God is love and we are God's children. There is no room for fear in love.

We love because God loved us first.

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith.

#### [Silence]

God our Father, we confess to you and to our fellow members in the Body of Christ that we have sinned in thought, word and deed, and in what we have failed to do. We are truly sorry. Forgive us our sins, and deliver us from the power of evil, for the sake of your Son who died for us, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

[OLIVER] God, who is both power and love, forgive you and free you from your sins, heal and strengthen you by the Holy Spirit, and raise you to new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

## Gloria - [Greening - MAGNUS WALKER]

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

# Collect - [OLIVER]

Faithful to your promise, O God, you have lifted up the lowly, clothing with heavenly splendour the woman who bore Christ, our life and resurrection. Grant that the Church, prefigured in Mary, may bear Christ to the world and come to share his triumph. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

for all displaced by war and violence, in overcrowded refugee camps or making perilous voyages in search of safety; for those

who work to relieve their plight and oppose the narratives which dehumanise and devalue them

for all trying to salvage their lives amongst the wreckage and rubble of Beirut, and for those working alongside them

for all living on the streets or threatened with the loss of their home due to the disruptions of coronavirus; for homeless charities and those who work for economic and urban regeneration

Give shelter and succour to those in need; and strength and hope to those who support them.

Son of Mary, hear our prayers.

We pray for those who are hungry ...

for the increasing numbers who are dependent on food banks, for those who speak out against the narratives which dehumanise and devalue them, and all who work to keep food banks operational and accessible

for those who go hungry because their fields feed a demand for low prices, endless choice and unseasonal availability; for Fair trade organisations that support and champion them; and all who make plain the consequences our greed has for those who supply our tables

Give bread to those who are hungry, and hunger for justice to those who are fed.

Son of Mary, hear our prayers.

We pray for those who are victimised, ostracised or marginalised because of race, religion, gender or sexuality ...

for all in fear of the increasingly strident voices which reinforce prejudice and stir up hate; and those who by word and action, oppose these dehumanising narratives for all whose isolation has been heightened by the coronavirus epidemic and all involved in networks offering support and care to them

Give comfort and resilience to those who are devalued, threatened and excluded, and encouragement and joy to those who lift and shelter them

Son of Mary, hear our prayers.

We pray for your church as it works to keep Mary's song uplifted and embodied ...

for Kevin our Bishop and for the Churches of St Mungo's, Alexandria and St Augustine's, Dumbarton

for those responsible for planning church reopening, and balancing resources to ensure provision and welcome for all

for the ministries of support, encouragement and healing in local congregations; for Elizabeth and Ann for whom prayer has been requested today, and others known to us whom we name before you now ....

Give wisdom and discernment, resourcefulness, courage, and energy to your body here on earth until that day when the vision of your Kingdom with its narrative of full and flourishing life becomes the present reality of all.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation,
we enter into our heritage
in the company of the Virgin Mary,
the apostles, and prophets,
and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end.
