Bishop Kevin became the Bishop of Glasgow and Galloway on Wednesday this week and he will join us for the first time as our bishop in this service and will be our preacher today.

Dear friends at the cathedral in Glasgow and throughout the diocese of Glasgow and Galloway. Thank you for inviting me to join in worship with you this morning. Elspeth and I are very sorry that we can't be with you in person and we are very aware of the tragedy that the City of Glasgow has endured so very recently. We look forward to meeting you all and visiting the cathedral and all the churches of the diocese, as soon as that is possible. This morning we are very happy to join you after the service for your virtual coffee morning.

Reading: Matthew 11:16-19,25-30 - [DAVID]

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mathew. Glory to Christ our Saviour.

Jesus said, 'But to what will I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the market-places and calling to one another,

"We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not mourn."

For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, "He has a demon"; the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds.'

At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'

Sermon [BISHOP KEVIN PEARSON]

+In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Words from that gospel of Matthew we have just heard:

The Todd River in South Western Australia. The Todd River flows like any river all the time but for most the time the waters of the Todd river are not visible. But when the waters erupt and the river begins to go into flood, when the waters erupt the whole town leave their shops, offices, schools to go to the river bank to witness the waters flowing across the dry river bed, the community meet to witness and to celebrate the abundance of life giving water, because the whole community constantly watch the dry river bed looking for signs of life giving water.

We are all made in the image of God, God who is love and what that means is that deep, deep, deep within every human being flows a yearning to be with God in love we know, feel, share whether we are always able to recognise that face or not. By tradition that place deep, deep, deep within we call the soul, that place where my reason and my feelings and my hopes and my fears meet and sometimes erupt but always they flow because the soul is the place where I am most authentically me. When Jesus said you have hidden these things but revealed them to infants, that is not an exhortation to put aside wisdom, intelligence, it is to embrace the wonder of God's creation. To an infant the world of experience is one endless wonder. The first baptism I ever performed as a

priest of one week's experience. As I held the child a butterfly hovered over the font and she put out her hand to try and catch it, the illusive butterfly of faith. The infant saw something colourful, attractive, light, and she wanted to hold it.

What the pandemic has taught us is the truth of the Todd River. Deep, deep, deep within every human being made in the image of God is the yearning to love and to give love. We have witnessed spontaneous acts of generosity and kindness in all our communities, our streets literally have not been empty but filled with loving kindness, which erupted like the waters of the Todd river, as has the yearning in many to know something, just something of God, in recognition there is more to life - it is deeper than what we see and spend.

As I arrive in the Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway it seems to me the Holy Spirit is presenting enormous opportunities to our Diocese, to our congregations and to each of us individually as disciples of Jesus.

To our Diocese the Holy Spirit is emptying, flowing, in our desire to meet on the banks of the Todd river to celebrate, God is with us. We have learnt many lessons in these months of lockdown, lessons in how much we need each other and what it is to be a community of faith. How structures and technology can help spread the Gospel of being inclusive, welcoming, how exciting faith with God actually is – we celebrate God's faithfulness to us. Jesus said today: My yoke is easy my burden is light.

The faithfulness of our congregations who meet week by week on the banks of the river to pray for their communities. Whether those communities recognise the waters of God's love flowing around in in them, we meet to pray for them, with them as God is with us. Even the Bishop's Protocols for the opening of churches, the Holy Spirit presents us with new opportunities to welcome people even if it is with masks and hand sanitiser.

As Jesus said today: come to me all who are weary, and I will give you rest.

And to each of us as individual disciples, remember the Todd River. It flows whether it is always visible or not. It erupts when someone asks you on Monday morning in the shop, why do you got to Church? Just say, because there I have an experience of the living God.

Now, whosoever, whatsoever, howsoever, you describe God, are wonderful questions – face them, as we faced the closure of our churches. We closed not in fear but in love. The Holy Spirit leads us to open, even with masks and sanitiser, not in fear but in love.

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
